
Dear Parents

We have had a fantastic end to the half term with our Harvest events this week. The performances by Phase 1 and 2 were wonderful with the children singing and performing with such confidence and enjoyment. For our youngest children from the children in the Reception classes, it was the first time on the Southfield Park stage and they rose to the occasion so well, making everyone extremely proud - especially Mrs Greenacre and Miss Egan who were delighted. Thank you for all supporting the events and for your generosity in the donations for the Foodbank, which were collected today.

The Phase 3 Harvest Fair after school yesterday was a great success and is always a great opportunity for the whole school to come together and have fun. The children in years 4, 5 and 6 have been busy planning games, making small items to sell and baking over the past week and this year we raised nearly £300 which we will also be passing to the Foodbank to help local families in need.

She competed in four separate disciplines, winning silver medals in the floor and bars events, and bronze medals in the vault and beam events. In the overall competition, she came third, winning a bronze medal, and has therefore been invited to the World Competition to be held in America in 2019. This is such a huge achievement and everyone is very excited for her. We will keep you all updated with how she progresses and I am sure you will all join us here in wishing her good luck.



Today the school was awash with pink accessories as we supported the Wear It Pink campaign for Breast Cancer Now. The voluntary donations were counted by Georgia and Olivia in Year 6 this afternoon, and totalled over £300, an amazing amount for an amazing cause—thank you to everyone who contributed!






Attendance this week
