




Attendance this week

Applications received by Surrey Admissions after this date will be dealt with as a late application, and looked at AFTER the other applications have been allocated a school place. You may not be offered a place at your preferred school.

Changing Meal Patterns for January 2019

Children can change their meal patterns at the start of each half term. If you would like to do this, you need to let the office know by the end of the half term before—so just before the half term break or just before the Christmas, Easter or Summer break.
