Dear Parents,

Welcome back and a Happy New year to everyone. I would like to take the opportunity to say 'thank you' from all the staff for the very generous and thoughtful gifts at the end of the Autumn Term. Staff were overwhelmed by the kind gestures, and they feel very lucky to have such supportive parents.

All year groups have started their new topics and when the Senior Leadership Team completed learning walks this week, we all commented on how enthused and engaged the children were across the school, whether they were travelling by Jeep in the 'Jungle Explorer' zones in Year 2 or dressed as superheroes in Reception - everyone was certainly inspired.





Our Year 5 children travelled back in time this week as they arrived at school on Wednesday, dressed in Victorian costumes to celebrate Victorian day. The classrooms were set in rows and their lessons were delivered in true Victorian style by Miss David and

Mrs Littlewood, complete with gowns and mortar boards - I am not sure who enjoyed the day more!

Today we had an invasion of 'Vicious Vikings' when our Year 4 children completed a fantastic interactive Viking workshop to start their new topic. I know both of these events really captured the children's interests as you can see from the photographs. Our thanks to all of the parents for the amazing outfits, the children looked simply superb.

This term we are continuing with our Power Thoughts programme with the children taking part in their second workshop 'Mistakes are cool' on Tuesday 29th and Wednesday 30th January. They will learn how to reframe 'failure', embrace their mistakes and use it as an opportunity to grow. They will learn how to deal with setbacks and challenges so that they are able to develop their resilience and 'bounce back' with power. Through the workshop the children will also gain a deeper understanding of how their brain grows and changes when making mistakes and facing challenges. These workshops are facilitated by Natalie Costa and she will be running a parent session on Tuesday 29th January between 5:30pm—6:30pm. Natalie will explain the themes of the workshops the children will be covering this academic year, so that parents can become more familiar with the tools and the strategies taught. This will allow parents to support their children with their academic and home life, and through the challenges they may face through the transitions they will encounter as they continue to develop. It would be wonderful to have a good turnout for the parent workshop. Therefore if you are planning to attend the workshop, please complete the slip later in the newsletter or email Mrs Pereira, as this will give us an idea of how many people to expect.

We are extremely lucky at Southfield Park to have a very dedicated group of governors, they are all volunteers who give up their time to support the school with their expertise and ideas. A vacancy has arisen for a Parent Governor as Mark Hinton-Jones (dad to Ruby and Jasmine) has come to the end of his four year term. 



I hope that you all had a lovely, relaxing Christmas break and a very happy New Year. I would like to start this Newsletter by thanking you for your feedback regarding our 'Anti-Bullying Leaflet for Parents' at the Parent Consultation meetings in November.

Please see the feedback we gratefully received below:

What we are doing well

- * It is great that we have an Anti-Bullying Ambassador in each class.
- * We raise awareness of and promote our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors well.
- * We talk about empathy in child-friendly language.

What could be improved

- ⇒ A whistle-blowing system could be put in place.
- ⇒ Staff and Anti-Bullying Ambassadors should closely monitor children who are lonely in the playgrounds.

The feedback is greatly appreciated and it was brilliant to see such positive responses. By sharing your thought and ideas, I am able to make changes and reflect further upon anti-bullying provision here at school.

Regarding the whistle-blowing system, I would like to assure parents that within our 'Staff Behaviour Policy (Code of Conduct)' there is a section headed: Sharing Concerns and Recording Incidents,



Whistleblowing. This policy is updated annually, reviewed by our governor Graham Cox and is shared with all members of staff at the beginning of each academic year. It is a requirement that all members of staff read this policy and sign it to show that they adhere to the policy. This staff behaviour policy also makes reference to a separate 'Whistleblowing Policy' which is available to all members of staff should they need it.

In terms of a whistle-blowing system for children, each classroom has a 'Worry Box' where children can write any concerns they may have for themselves or for their peers. Each Worry Box is monitored regularly by the Class Teacher to

ensure any worries are dealt with promptly and that necessary support can be put into place.

I would also like to assure parents that a vital part of our Teaching Assistant's role is to monitor vulnerable and lonely children in the playgrounds at playtimes and lunch times, and to intervene and provide support when it is needed. Additionally, during our Anti-Bullying Ambassador training session in the autumn term, the Ambassadors learnt how to spot bullying and how to help if they think somebody is being bullied. During our next training session, later in the spring term, I will remind the Ambassadors to keep an eye out for any lonely children in the playground and on our 'buddy benches', so they can provide peer support for these children.

Following your feedback, I have also created a display in our school atrium called the 'Kindness Tree' (pictured right). This is a display that all children in the school have regular access to and enjoy engaging with. On the Kindness Tree are different acts of kindness for the children to choose and perform, examples include: 'look out for any lonely children in the playground and ask them to play' and 'keep an eye on the buddy bench — does anyone need a friend?' I hope that these particular acts of kindness that I have mentioned above, will encourage all children to look out for each other and to include different children in their play. The Kindness Tree also inspires children to think of their own acts of kindness which they can share on the blank leaves for others to perform.



Also with your feedback and the feedback from our first Anti-Bullying Partnership meeting, I have updated our Anti-Bullying Leaflet for Parents. This updated version is available as a hard copy in the office vestibule, electronically via our school website and this week our Admin Assistant, Sarah Hutton, has sent it electronically as a ParentMail. I hope that this means you are able to easily access the online links within the leaflet that can offer support and advice.

Thank you for your continued support and I hope that you are able to see the difference your feedback is making to our school ethos and community.

Kyen: "Victorian day was fun and exciting because we learnt how to write with an ink pen and in the old English style of handwriting"









Playground Behaviour and Car Parking

A lot of people are afraid of dogs, and it can be scarey to have to walk passed them when they jump up and bark, even when they are tied up, so please be thoughtful of others feelings.

Car parking has been so much more considerate recently, but please don't park in a way which even partially blocks in other parked cars; a car was nearly damaged this week when trying to reverse out of a parking space, so please make use of surrounding streets if there isn't a proper parking space available.


