Dear Parents,

It is a 'Bumper Edition' of the newsletter today covering the past two weeks. This time last week, we were in the midst of our very own Freaky Friday. The children were really excited as they came into school in different clothes and strange hair styles, as well as lots of other exciting 'broken rules' for the day. The event was all in aid of raising funds for the Friends of Southfield Park and we are delighted to say that we raised £1,235. All of money raised by the friends goes directly to the children, both supporting the curriculum, as well as providing some of the 'extras' our budget simply does not cover. Thank you to everyone for supporting the event and making it a success.



Last week we had our second group of 'Power Thoughts' workshops run by Natalie Costa. Natalie was in school over two days delivering workshops on the theme 'Mistakes are Cool'. She taught the children strategies to be positive about mistakes and use them as opportunities to reflect and learn as well as providing training sessions for staff and parents to encourage the children to develop their resilience and think of mistakes positively. We have received excellent feedback from all the different groups who went to the workshops and are looking forward to the next sessions which are scheduled for the summer term.



Children in Years 5 and 6 have been out and about at two sporting events this week, with both the girls and boys football teams in action. The girls' football team, which included girls from Year 5 and Year 6, had a friendly match against Danetree Primary School after school on Tuesday. The girls all played superbly as a team, showing great skills and determination, winning the match 3:1. Thank you to Mrs Pereira for organising the match and to the parents who turned out to support them on a very cold afternoon.

On Wednesday morning, it was the turn of the Year 6 boys, who competed in a tournament in Dorking organised by Chelsea. The standard was exceptionally high and the boys played brilliantly. Although they didn't win the competition they were certainly not outplayed, and showed both teamwork and resilience in some very competitive matches. Thank you to Miss Smith who accompanied the team and to all the parents who transported the boys to and from the event and came to cheer them on.



We are regularly asked for advice on supporting children with developing reading comprehension skills in the Juniors so this week on Tuesday evening Mrs Del Medico and Mrs Hall ran a parent workshop. We have received really positive feedback from all the parents who attended who are very keen to put into practice the practical strategies and ideas they were given during the session. There will be a similar session for parents with children in KS1 in March, and we hope to have an even larger turn out, so watch this space for the date and time. Thank you to Mrs Del Medico and Mrs Hall for organising such an informative session and for giving up their time at the end of a long day to run the sessions. I know the parents who attended really appreciated it.

We have noticed over the past few weeks that a number of dogs are coming onto the school site. It is Surrey County Council Policy that schools are 'dog free' zones (obviously apart from Guide Dogs etc.) for both health and safety reasons as well as that some children are anxious around dogs. We would ask that if you do bring your dog to school that you leave them outside the main gate. Please tie your dog's lead to the green fence to the right of the main entrance, but not too close to the gate, so that everyone can easily walk past. Your co-operation with this is really appreciated.

Finally, I would like to welcome Martyn Howarth to the Governing Body. Martyn has recently been appointed as a Parent Governor and has already been into school to talk about the role and is really keen to contribute to our school development. Many of you will know that Angela Howarth is one of our joint Chairs of the Friends so Martyn has been in school often and has a good understanding of what makes Southfield Park 'tick'. He will be a great addition to our Governing Body and we are looking forward to working with him as a Governor.

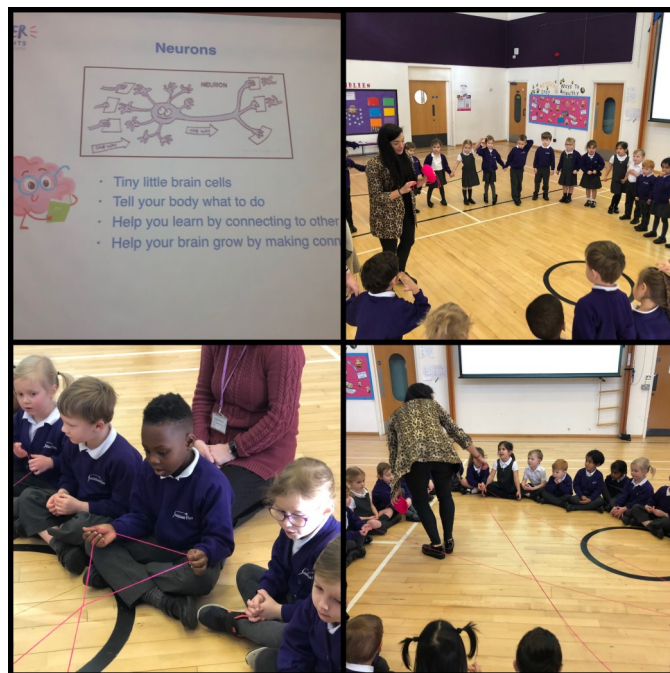

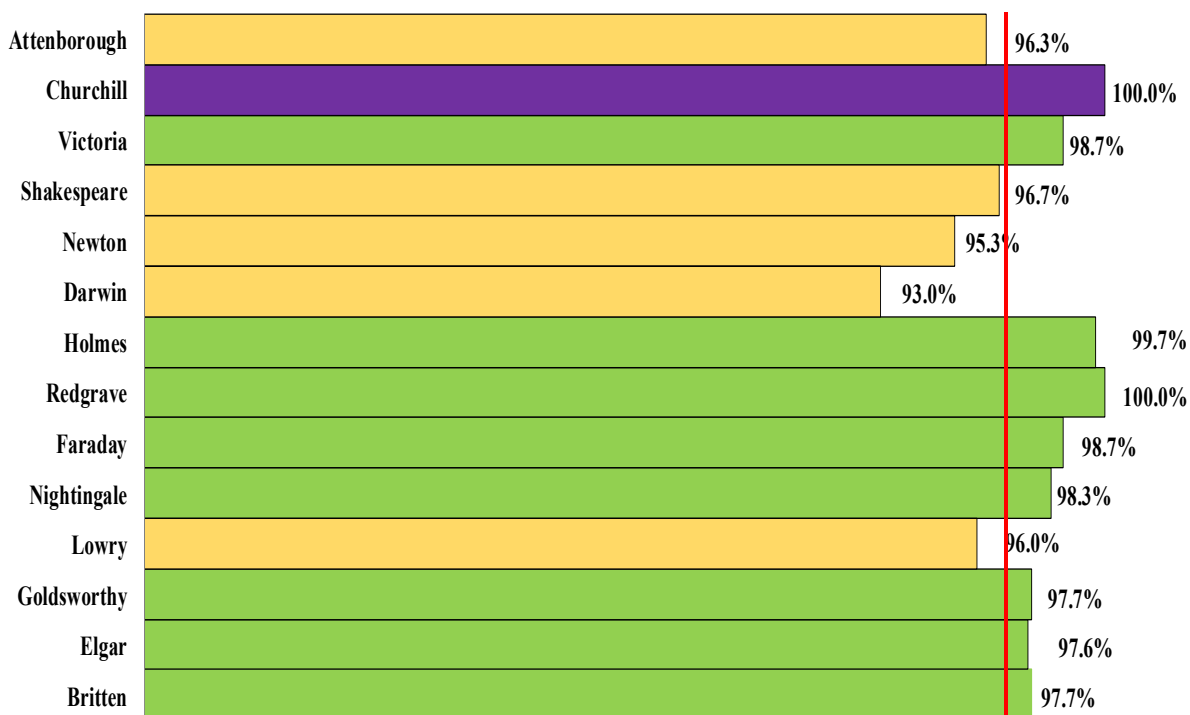


## Attendance this week

# Pasta Pots for Year 5 & 6 Lunch

This week the kitchen introduced Pasta Pots at lunchtimes on Mondays and Fridays, which are available to children in Years 5 & 6 who normally have a school dinner on that day.

On Mondays the pasta is in a cheesy sauce, with the option of additional ham, while on Fridays it is in a tomato sauce, with the option of additional sausage or meatballs (these will alternate, so one week will be sausage and the next will be meatballs). Selections can also be made from the salad bar and bread basket, as well as pudding being available.

For now, the children just need to ask for the pasta option when they go in for lunch in the same way they do for a jacket potato. We will see how it goes and discuss with the kitchen whether, in the future, we will need the children to choose their meal choice for that day.

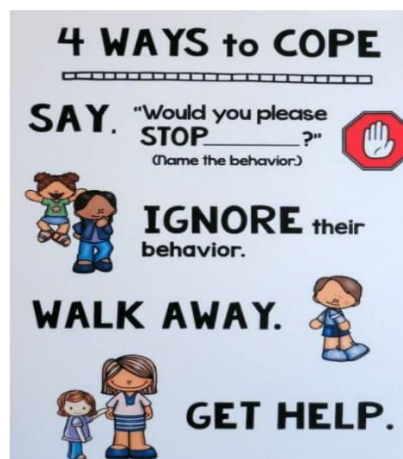
