

Parking around Southfield Park Primary School

A local resident has emailed asking that we remind parents again about parking considerately on the residential roads around school. Parking across driveways and on the pavements results in frustration and delays for those who want to go about their business. Even if you expect to be only a short time, for dropping off or picking up, please can everyone makes the effort to be thoughtful when they park on the roads.

Surrey County Council recommends that residents contact their local borough or district council's parking team if a vehicle is blocking access, who can issue a penalty charge notice if a vehicle is parked across a dropped kerb, even if there is no access protection marking painted on the road.

The council has no enforcement powers against pavement parking in uncontrolled roads. Where there are no waiting restrictions (i.e. yellow lines) on the road, enforcement can only be done by Surrey Police. If there is a situation where pedestrians, pram or wheel chair users are being forced into a busy road as a result of inconsiderate parking, then it should be reported to Surrey Police, on the non-emergency phone number 101.

The story explores bullying in an age-appropriate way and makes children aware of strategies they can use if they feel somebody is being bullied, such as speaking to a trusted adult. 1. Impact from our first meeting

- Parent-friendly anti-bullying leaflet has been updated using feedback from the Anti-Bullying Partnership group and from parent feedback at Parents' Evening in November. This is available on the school website, as a hard copy in the office vestibule and has been sent electronically via ParentMail.
- ⇒ Silver Anti-Bullying Chartermark award symbol has been added to the parent leaflet and the school website anti-bullying section and awards page. It is also now included on the Anti-Bullying Newsletters (half-termly) which are part of the school newsletter sent via ParentMail.
- ⇒ Have emailed two companies to enquire about anti-bullying workshops for the summer term. 'Perform for Schools' and 'Action Work'. Once they are arranged, I will remind/ask class teachers to give children some time (back in the classroom) for reflection and to discuss what they have learnt following the workshops.
- Agreed with Sarah Hutton that when a new child joins a class during the school year, Anti-Bullying Leaflet for Parents will be included in their information pack.
- Next academic year we will build upon our good practice and hold a fundraising event to raise money for an anti-bullying charity. Also, hold an assembly to explain the work of the charity that we are raising money for and explain how they can provide support.

2. How Camilla's resources have been used here at school

- ⇒ 'We're All Wonders' book and the supporting teacher resource pack was used by LG to lead a whole school assembly in the spring term.
- ⇒ The Anti-Bullying Ambassadors read 'Topsy and Tim Help a Friend' to all infant classes following their second training session.


3. Anti-Bullying Partnership Display Board


