#### Dear Parents,

It was lovely to see so many parents (and grandparents, uncles, auntie's and family friends too!) at the Summer Fair last weekend, and especially nice to catch up with some of our past pupils. It was, as always, a great success and everyone who came enjoyed themselves. The weather was kind to us with only a brief shower, so all in all a great day. Thanks to the fantastic Friends of Southfield Park for all their hard work both before and on the day and also to everyone who helped man the stalls, set up and tidy away, donated items and came along to support - it really is a whole community effort. The final calculations are still underway but the total raised is over £5000 so far, a huge amount that will make a difference to all of the children.

One of the areas that the Friends have been supporting is the redevelopment of the pond area and this week the children have been enjoying the pond-dipping sessions that have been paid for, and organised by, the Friends. The pond area is a great teaching resource that will really enrich our science curriculum, looking at pond life, habitats and the eco system. It can also be used as a stimulus for writing, for artwork and much more and I know it will be well used. Thank you to Mr Williams who has been working hard (in all weathers) on the pond and surrounding areas to make it the superb learning space it now is.



As you may remember, last year we achieved the Silver Anti-Bullying Chartermark in recognition of our excellent inclusive practise. This year we have fully embedded and built on the silver award and I am delighted to tell you that in a recent visit the Anti-Bullying Chartermark Assessors have awarded the school the GOLD standard award. They were in school for a whole morning looking carefully at all our policies and procedures, meeting the children and talking to staff, governors and parents, praising highly the 'positive ethos and appropriate behaviour across the school'. In the report, the lead assessor said 'it was a privilege to see all the hard work the school community has put in to ensure the pupils, staff and parents are aware of your anti bullying message.' Miss Gilby has been the champion of all of our

anti-bullying work and her commitment and dedication were also recognised in the report, highlighting her 'outstanding job at leading your anti-bullying work throughout the school'. We are all exceptionally proud of Miss Gilby and this achievement.

It is at this time of year when inevitably we say a fond farewell to some of our staff who move on to pastures new. This year we have three teachers who are leaving us, two for new and exciting roles in teaching and one who is going travelling for a year. Miss Egan joined us as a Newly Qualified Teacher 5 years ago and is leaving to take up a position as a Year 2 teacher at a school in Wimbledon from September. Over her time at Southfield Park, we have seen her blossom and grow, and her work on developing art within the school has been invaluable. Similarly, Miss Barrett joined us as an NQT three years ago and has worked in both



Reception and Year 1 having such a positive impact on all the children she has worked with and we will really miss her as part of our team. She is moving to teach in the in the private sector. We wish them both well in their new roles - their new schools are lucky to have them.

Miss Georgia Smith joined the team three years ago and has been our PE leader since she joined, working really hard to ensure the children have wide opportunities to participate in as many sporting events as possible. She has worked hard to develop our PE curriculum and her passion for PE is huge. She is travelling next year and we are all envious of the adventures she has ahead of her and we are hopeful she may come back to us in the future. We are sad to say goodbye to them all but know they will keep in touch and take a little of Southfield Park with them as we go. We will update you about the new staff that will be joining our team next week.



The Epsom and Ewell Dance Festival is always a key date in our timetable and this year was no exception with our performances at the Playhouse on Tuesday and Wednesday evening. This year's theme was show tunes and our brilliant group of dancers from Year 4 entertained the audience with a routine to a medley of Abba songs from Mamma Mia. They clearly loved the opportunity to perform on stage and made us all really proud. Mrs Glasspool, Miss Smith and Mrs Walker have been rehearsing with the children since the beginning of term and have really enjoyed seeing the routine develop. Thank you to them all for giving up their time to give the children such an exciting and memorable experience.

A huge well done to our Year 5 and 6 children who took part in the Tri-Golf Tournament at Epsom College yesterday afternoon. Southfield Park came 1<sup>st</sup>, winning with 1704 points! This was an amazing achievement and we are extremely proud of all of them.





## Wheels in the Playground and around the school site

Please can parents keep an eye on their children and remind them that, to reduce the risk of accidents, they mustn't ride bikes or scooters in the playgrounds at any time.

Other danger areas include around the bike sheds and the school-owned parking spaces inside the school boundary green gates, where children sometimes speed around as they go to and from the bike sheds. This is a working area and vehicles can be moving around there, so everyone needs to be really careful and not treat it like a play area.

All children should stay behind the cones in the Infant playground as they wait for older siblings to finish in the Juniors, and we ask that parents remain alert to their child's whereabouts and activity and remind them about appropriate behaviour while on school grounds.

Last year, as a school, we received the Silver Anti-Bullying Chartermark, which we were awarded for our excellent anti-bullying curriculum, policy, training opportunities and the great level of support that we provide for the children here at school. Following this accreditation last April, we received a report with a huge number of strengths but also recommendations to achieve the gold award.

This year, I have worked closely with the Anti-Bullying Partnership group to develop our anti-bullying provision, ethos and policy. We have reflected upon our provision and events to ensure they are regular, high-quality and meaningful for our children. We have also developed our anti-bullying leaflet for parents (created by the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors) to ensure that it is accessible and useful.

I have also met regularly with the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors to develop their role this year and they have taken part in a wide range of activities. This has really raised their profile and as you will have seen from previous Anti-Bullying Newsletters this year, they have been very busy and simply incredible in their roles.




I am very proud of our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and Partnership group and the part they play in our school. This year they have all played an active role in promoting the anti-bullying ethos within school and have had such a positive impact upon our events and provision.

As a result of working together, we have achieved the Gold Surrey Anti-Bullying Chartermark and I am incredibly proud of this achievement. Thank you **SO** much to the ambassadors and to the partnership members for supporting us this year - you really have made such a difference to our school community.

### In other anti-bullying news...

As I mentioned in the previous Anti-Bullying Newsletter, following their training session, the ambassadors came up with ideas in order to update their display board in the hall (ideas pictured right). They then worked together as a team to decide upon the colours, lettering and the content they wanted on their board. After lots of discussion, they agreed that they wanted to include different scenarios for children to read and decide if they were bullying or not, useful anti-bullying strategies, posters which they were to create themselves, a large anti-bullying badge and the lettering STOP BULLYING – as well as two big photographs of themselves! You can see their board on the next page and I am sure you will agree that it looks brilliant as well as being very helpful for their peers here at school.





Also this half term, our atrium display has been updated, inspired by the Disney Pixar film UP (pictured right). The children have been writing their ideas on the balloons as to how we can prevent bullying at Southfield Park and how we can cheer somebody up if they are feeling down. They have come up with such lovely ideas and a big thank you from me must go to Mrs Crawford and Miss Hylands who masterminded the display!



The Reading Agency and Surrey Libraries are excited to bring you this year's **SPACE CHASE**, **Summer Reading Challenge 2019**. Inspired by the 50th anniversary of the moon landing, Space Chase will take young readers on an out-of-this-world adventure with our super space family, The Rockets.

The Summer Reading Challenge takes place every year during the summer holidays and is a fun reading promotion for children aged 4-11. Children's reading progress can slow during the holidays if they don't have regular access to books to read for pleasure. The Summer Reading Challenge really helps with this. There is no other reading activity that involves so many children, introduces families to their local library, encourages children to choose books freely and independently and is endorsed by teachers and the Department for Education. The Summer Reading Challenge runs from **Saturday 13 July until Saturday 14 September**, so there is plenty of time to get involved.

Epsom Library welcome all children to come and take part in the challenge. They can read any type of library books they like, be rewarded with incentives and special stickers along the way and will receive a personalised certificate upon completion – and it's all **FREE!** 

In addition to the Challenge, libraries will be running a variety of different craft activities over the holidays, from drop-ins to planned events, so there are lots of things to get involved with this summer.
