Dear Parents,

It has been quieter around school this week with our Year 5 children off on their residential trip to PGL but it has still been a hive of activity here with so much going on.

The PGL trip has been a big success and Mrs Gee has been in regular contact with us here, keeping us up to date with all the activities. The children are 'having a ball' in the IoW. The weather has been dry and sunny but to be honest I don't think even a drop of rain would have dampened their spirits! The children have behaved beautifully and been great ambassadors for our school - a real pleasure to accompany. I am sure they will be very tired on their return and full of news about all their achievements. Thanks to all the staff who have gone along and left their own families for the week, I know they will need the weekend to recover too.





Year 6 are continuing with their exciting 'post SATs' activities and this week have practised their cooking skills and learned about healthy eating choices and a balanced diet when the Mobile Kitchen visited school on Tuesday afternoon. The children all enjoyed creating their own bespoke healthy wrap and hopefully it has inspired them to try something new that they haven't tasted before. On Thursday, they were off to Box Hill for the rescheduled visit to the River Mole that was cancelled earlier this month because of the heavy rain. This time we had dry, sunny weather and the children

were able to complete their geography fieldwork and look at the features of rivers they had learned about in the classroom in action to embed their learning, as well as experiencing a day in the beautiful outdoors.

Our Quiz Club team, Emily Troesher, William Chambers, Harry Kirk and Alex Hughes, travelled to London on Thursday afternoon to compete in the National Finals of the event at The National Gallery in London. Mrs Glasspool and the children's parents accompanied them for this exciting trip to share their fantastic knowledge by competing against twelve other teams. They gave a tremendous performance, finishing in a very creditable 6th position, and made us all really proud of them.





It is always a privilege to hear about, and celebrate, the fantastic achievements of the children in the various events and competitions they take part in outside of school. We

are therefore delighted to share with you that we now have a World Karate Champion in our midst, as Sara Annuar in Year 6 competed in, and won, the WUKF World Championship in the Brown-Black category last weekend. Sara competed against 20 other girls, and the result is an amazing achievement for her and endorsement not only of her skill, but also of her commitment and determination. We are all so proud of her.

The end of year 'performance season' has now well and truly begun and got off to a fabulous start with our Phase 1 children sharing their 'Summer Celebration' with their families on Thursday and Friday mornings. Some of the Year 1 children were dressed as grandparents reminiscing about their school days and sharing all their memories of this year. At this time of year it is always a treat to stand back and reflect on everything the children have achieved over the year and how far they have come in such a short space of time. It reminds us all of what special times these are in a child's life and how lucky we are to be part of it. There was wonderful singing and dancing, as well as great acting skills, on display and I have told Mrs Gee that there is a replacement ready and waiting to take her place in Harriet Rix!



Last week we told you about the staff who are leaving us to pastures new and this week we can introduce you to three new members of the teaching team from September. Miss Shannen Mulvihill, who the parents and children in Shakespeare Class will know well as she completed her final teaching practice with us in the Autumn and Spring terms (as well as accompanying the Year 5 residential to the IoW this week), will be joining us as a Class Teacher from September this year. Miss Frances Foley and Miss Alyssa Valbuena will also be joining us, both relocating to Surrey having previously taught at schools in Kent. We are lucky to have attracted

such high calibre staff to work at the school and are looking forward to welcoming them to our team. The new teachers will all be in school next Tuesday for our 'Moving Up' morning and will meet their new classes then. 




Attendance this week


