Dear Parents,

This week has been simply jam-packed with events and despite the scorching heat we have crammed so much into 5 action filled days that this is a bumper edition newsletter!

Science Week is always a hugely popular event across the whole school, and this year has been no exception. Mrs Greenacre and Mrs Parry-Finneran, our Science subject leaders, have spent hours masterminding a week full of scientific discoveries for the children, culminating in today's Science Fair in the school hall where each class designed two science activities for the rest of the school to enjoy. There were whoops of delight and amazement from the children as they explored and enhanced their scientific learning. A big thank you goes to them both for organising such a thrilling and engaging week, which also included a session for every class with the outreach team from the Science Museum who visited us on Wednesday. The Science Museum workshops were absolutely amazing and the children simply loved them. We are so grateful to the Friends of Southfield Park for paying for these superb workshops from their fundraising efforts which really impacted positively on every child's learning experiences. We are so lucky!

Those families who attended the Epsom and Ewell School's Dance Festival at The Playhouse this week will, I am sure, agree with me what a fantastic event it was. The theme was 'Around the World' and each school took a different approach to their dance with a variety of dance

styles represented and a wide range of musical choices. Our entry was based on a Japanese theme, and choreographed by Mrs Glasspool to tell the story of a couple growing old together. It was such a privilege to see the children enjoying their opportunity to appear on stage and we were all very proud of them. Thank you to Mrs Glasspool, Mrs Walker and Miss Smith who helped with all the preparations and rehearsals but a special thanks must go to our very own Southfield Park hero, Mrs Glasspool, who not only attended the dress rehearsal all day on Monday with Mrs Walker, but came straight to the Playhouse from the Year 6 trip to Chessington World of Adventures on Tuesday with her trusty suitcase of props and



costumes. She then followed Wednesday evening's performance with a field trip to the River Mole all day on Thursday. And all of this with a great big smile on her face. We don't know how you do it Mrs Glasspool, but we are so grateful for everything you do!

Year 6 have been out and about this week with their long awaited trip to Chessington and the postponed trip to the River Mole. Tuesday was extremely hot but that didn't stop the children making the most of every second at the theme park and going on as many rides as they could fit in. Not a second was wasted! They all had a brilliant time, and so did the staff, and it was so lovely to see them able to 'let their hair down' and have fun after working so hard all year. Luckily, Thursday was a bit cooler and we managed to dodge the wet weather to have a great day down by the river learning about river features as part of their geography topic. Thank you to all the adults that attended the trips to make them truly memorable for the children.

Our Parent focus Group met on Wednesday afternoon for the final meeting of the year and we had a very productive meeting. Minutes of the discussions will be circulated soon. I would like to say a huge thank you to the fantastic groups of class reps for all their support this year, in attending the meetings and liaising with the other parents about items to be raised for discussion. We really do value parents' ideas and suggestions and the reps really help in ensuring we know 'the word on the playground' and take parents viewpoints and suggestions for improvement into account.

Schools are always subject to scrutiny and external validation, and this week our teacher assessments for the Key Stage 1 SATs were moderated by Surrey. Two moderators spent the morning with Miss Gilby and Miss Gilbody and were highly complimentary about both the quality of work produced by the children and the teacher's knowledge of the children, as well as praising the accuracy of the judgements. All of our assessment judgements were confirmed by the moderators and the practice of the Year 2 teachers was described as exemplary. We know what a brilliant Year 2 team we have, and what amazing teachers they are, so we are very proud to have it confirmed by independent parties.

Development of our coaching ethos throughout the school has been a key feature over the past couple of years, permeating all aspects of school life, and those of you who attended our parent coaching workshop a few weeks ago will be able to vouch for this. The introduction and development of coaching as a tool for self-improvement throughout the school has been led and driven by Mrs Smith, our Teaching and Learning coach as well as Assistant Head, who is a passionate advocate for the coaching approach. She recently led on an application for 'Coachmark' which is a national accreditation for excellence in coaching, and I am delighted to say that we heard at the end of last week that we have been awarded the Gold standard for this award, reflecting our excellent practice. In her report, the assessor commented, 'The coaching approach is now woven into the fabric of Southfield Park Primary and is integral I think to your SHINE mission statement.' I would like to thank Mrs Smith for leading the implementation of coaching and supporting colleagues to develop their skills as well as securing this prestigious achievement for the school.

It is at this time of year that we begin to welcome into our school community the children and families who will be joining us in September 2017. On Wednesday evening we held our information meeting for parents of children joining us in September and we look forward to them all becoming part of the 'Southfield Park family'. We also held a Reception to Year 1 transition meeting for parents of our current Reception classes on Wednesday explaining what we are doing to prepare the children for a smooth transition into Key Stage 1 and what they can expect as they continue their journey through the school and the exciting opportunities ahead. Thank you to all the members of staff who came along and spoke at these meetings, I know it was greatly appreciated by all who attended. If there is anyone who couldn't come along to the meetings we will upload the slides to Fronter so you can see the points covered.

The library refurbishment, which is being funded and organised by the Friends, is now moving at a fast pace and is very close to completion. The furniture was delivered and installed earlier this week and the artist they have commissioned to do the artwork has now started work, so we are all very excited. Watch this space for more updates! It really is going to look wonderful and the children will all benefit from the project and I am sure will spend many happy hours there and be inspired to read even more!

Finally, can I wish the year 5 children who are travelling to the Isle of Wight for their residential trip at PGL next week a fantastic time and remind parents of children in Phase 1 that next week we have the Phase 1 Summer Celebration Performances so please don't miss them.


Attendance this week


Y3 to make Magic Boxes
