Dear Parents,

As part of their learning about the Jewish faith, Year 1 visited the synagogue in Sutton on Tuesday morning. They travelled by train, which was itself a great adventure, and then had a tour of the synagogue. 



All workshops are 2.5 hours long, run from 10am-12.30pm and cost £20 per workshop.

**Age 7-11 Sewing Workshop**  
Designed to inspire your child to get sewing. They will learn a range of sewing techniques from threading a needle, cutting, pinning, hand and machine sewing and embroidery. These techniques will be used to make a variety of items.

**Age 7-11 Craft Workshop**  
Designed to inspire them to learn the love for all things crafty. Your child will engage in a range of different crafts including papercraft, felt, beads, collage – the list is endless!

**Age 12-16 Sewing Workshop – The Metre Challenge**  
The challenge is to take one metre of fabric and make something - anything! A top, a skirt, a bag, a cushion - what will they choose? Your child should think about their design prior to the class and bring along any other items they require. However, they must remember they can only use one metre of fabric! Machine and hand sewing techniques will be used.

**Age 12-16 Restyle a Garment Sewing Workshop**  
For children who are keen to learn and utilise their design skills. They bring a garment of their choice - such as a top, a skirt, a pair of trousers, and customise and restyle it to their own design. Customisation and embellishments can be machine or hand sewn, and embroidery and applique can be applied to the garment.

**Age 12-16 Sewing Workshop – Make a Bag**  
For children who would like to make a bag. One workshop will make a Shoulder bag, and the other workshop will make a Shopper/School bag. Machine and hand sewing techniques will be used.
