We have been taking part in 'Anti Bullying Week' and celebrating the theme of 'All Different. All Equal'. We began our week by watching a video in an assembly called 'For the birds' which focused on how people can be treated unfairly because they are different. As a whole school, we discussed how we are all unique and that it is important to celebrate our differences.
Classes also embraced this week by partaking in a range of engaging activities!
Reception classes have been busy discussing in their circle times what makes them happy and sad and how they can make their friends happy and be kind to others.
Year 1 have been focusing on the story of 'Something Else'- a character that is left out and treated unfairly because he is different to everybody else. The children felt sad for 'Something Else' and came up with ways to stop this from happening to anyone else.
Year $2 \& 3$ have been discussing diversity and how the world would be very boring if everyone was the same! The children were challenged with bingo grids and had to find 'someone who...' eg. Someone who celebrates Rosh Hashanah! The children have also made class paper chains to show how we are all united against bullying and how we are all different, but come together to make a class.
Higher up in the juniors, the children have been making power points during their computing sessions including slides about what bullying is and what to do if you or someone else is being bullied. They have also written some lovely and meaningful poems about bullying.
