#### Dear Parents,

The Spring term is now in full swing and we are all now back into our routines. There is a real buzz around the school with the children all starting their new topics and I have seen a lot of children this week with some excellent work, which is always a real treat.

This week has been Maths week and the children have enjoyed the challenge of fitting maths into as many different lessons as possible. Today the children have arrived in the Maths T Shirts and the range of different maths problems and questions has been amazing. Thank you to Miss David and Miss Gilbody for organising the week.

We had a Viking Invasion in school on Wednesday with the Year 4 children (and adults) arriving dressed as 'Vicious Vikings' ready for their fantastic drama workshop. 

# Changes to School Meal Patterns after the half term break

Please come to the school office to fill in a form if your child is going to be on a <u>different</u> school meal pattern after the half term break (starting Monday 19th February). Thank you!

#### ATTENDANCE

Just to remind you that our Attendance Policy clearly states:

The Education Welfare Service, acting on behalf of Surrey County Council may issue a Penalty Notice as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school and requires the recipient to pay a fixed amount.

The amount payable on issue of a Penalty Notice is £60 per child, per parent, if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days.

If the Penalty Notice is not paid within 28 days, the Local Authority must prosecute the parent/carer for failing to ensure regular school attendance under Section 444 Education Act 1996.

Circumstances when a Penalty Notice may be issued to parents/carers

- Where parents/carers are failing to secure their child's regular school attendance and are failing to engage with supportive measures to improve attendance proposed by the school or Education Welfare Officer a penalty notice may be issued.
- Where a child is taken out of school for an unauthorised leave of absence during term time for 5 consecutive days or more without the authority of the head teacher, each parent/carer is liable to receive a penalty notice for each child. In these circumstances, a warning will not be given where it can be shown that parents/carers had previously been warned that such absences would not be authorised.
- Where children are identified by Police and Education Welfare Officers engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have previously incurred unauthorised absences.
- Where attendance has fallen below 90% and there are no less than 7 unauthorised sessions during the preceding six school weeks. The parent/carer failure to engage with supportive measures proposed by the school or Education Welfare will be a factor when considering the issue of a Penalty Notice. Unauthorised absence will include late arrival after the close of registration without good reason.

With the exception of unauthorised leave of absence taken in term time, parents/carers will be sent a formal warning of their liability to receive such a notice before it is issued.

# Vicious Vikings

On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> January, Year 4 went back in time! The children came to school dressed as Vikings (they all looked fantastic) and even got to meet a real Viking who spent the entire day teaching the children all about weapons and battles, food and drink, clothing and much more!

In the morning, the children were able to hold different weapons such as spears and axes, learn about the different helmets the Vikings wore, (did you know, Vikings never actually had helmets with horns on!) and try on heavy bits of chain-mail!

The afternoon had even more fun to offer! The children played exciting games to find out more about what foods and drinks the Vikings did and didn't use and about their lifestyles! After that, the children were able to take part in a whole group story-telling of the mythical story of how Thor got his hammer!

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
