

# Newsletter 17 26/01/2018

Dear Parents,

It was lovely to see so many of you at our Open Classrooms this week and I hope you enjoyed looking through your child's books. The children have certainly been working hard as I have seen while auditing books this week with some external visitors. It is clear to see not just the high expectations the teachers have of the children but also the high expectations the children have of themselves; it certainly makes me very proud to see how hard they work across the curriculum. If you couldn't make the event and would like to see your child's books, please remember we are happy for them to go home over night so long as they are returned the next day. We can provide stickers for you to add a comment about what you like too! Just pop in and see your child's class teacher or send an email to the Office and we will be able to arrange this for you.



We had our first competitive football match of the term this week, where our 'A' team played against the Vale Primary School. The match was away and once we arrived at the football pitch, our first job was to stamp down the mole hills (there appear to be some very large moles on Epsom Downs!). The boys played extremely well, in tough conditions, and it was certainly a thrilling match, with an exciting finish as in the final minutes the boys managed to score the winning goal to make the score 3-2 to Southfield Park. It was very

entertaining to watch and Mrs Crawford and I were immensely proud, as the boys demonstrated great sportsmanship and represented the school so well. Thank you to the parents who transported and supported the team too. Fingers crossed that the kits come clean in the wash because as you can see from the picture, it was certainly muddy!

This week we have a number of people coming into to school to measure our progress against our School Development Plan priorities. Today, two of our governors, Chris McCormack and Julie Brown, came in to look at different aspects of our Teaching and Learning target with Mrs Sally Smith and on Tuesday Chris Byrne our School Improvement Partner (SIP) came to look at how effective our provision is for our most vulnerable learners. Next week our visiting governors will be writing a short piece linked to their monitoring for you to read but this morning our SIP Report arrived and I have included a couple of comments below as it really does demonstrate the high level of teaching and learning that takes place at Southfield Park on daily basis.

The quality of teaching is high throughout the school. Lessons observed were characterised by:

- \* Clear modelling by the teacher to clarify to children what is expected of them and encourage independence during activities without close supervision from an adult.
- \* Questioning to both check children's understanding and take their thinking on e.g. "What was significant about...?" (Year 6), "Why isn't it moving? (Year R).
- \* *A culture of improvement. Children report that they are expected to re-draft their previous efforts to "up-level" them. They appreciate this culture as it helps them to learn and give of their best.*

Children demonstrate positive learning dispositions. They sustain their attention for extended periods, collaborate well when required to do so, articulate their thinking clearly and confidently as well as listening attentively.

As a community we are constantly striving to be the best we can be, and constantly improving and developing. It has been sometime since our last formal inspection so these external validations are crucial to us in helping us self-evaluate our performance and look at ways to continuously improve and to receive such positive feedback is really important and pleasing.

Next week we are saying goodbye to Mrs Seaward who works as a special needs assistant in Shakespeare class. Mrs Seaward has been with us just over a year as a colleague but has been part of the Southfield Park community for over 10 years as both of her children have been to the school (and now moved on to Secondary school). It really is the end of an era for her and we all want to say thank you to her, and wish her well. She is returning to her previous role hand therapist with the NHS so I am sure she will be very busy. Her replacement Mrs Hanna Louis is already with us for a short handover period, so we welcome her to the team.

Can I remind parents that our bike sheds and scooter racks are open during school hours so it is essential that all scooters and bikes are locked up when left there. This week we have been advised that an unlocked scooter has gone missing so please make sure they are left secure as they are left at your own risk. If your child forgets their lock or loses it on the way to school, please let us know so we can help store it securely for that day.





### **Book Week**

As you know, every year we hold a week to celebrate reading and writing. This year, our English Week will be held from Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February through until Friday 2nd March. Our English Week will begin with a launch assembly introducing our theme of 'picture books'. Each year group will be choosing their own picture book to explore and base their

learning on for the week. The teachers are already very excited about Book Week and have planned lots of exciting learning opportunities for the children!

#### **Guess the Book**

To give children the chance to share one of their favourite books, on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February, we are asking each child to bring in a book (or a title of the book) and a set of 'clues' hidden in a bag to reveal to their class. At various points during the week, we will ask the children to reveal their clues and see if we can work out the title of the books. For example, for 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone', the clues in my bag could be a picture of a wand, a stone, an owl teddy and round glasses. Please ensure there are no more than four clues, which fit inside a small NAMED bag.

#### **Class Teacher Story Swap**

This year, the teachers will be swapping classes to read a story to a different class, which is a great opportunity for the children to experience hearing stories read by different adults.
