Those parents who attended will I am sure agree there were so many songs for the children to learn so a big thank you to Mrs Miniuks and Mrs Jansen for all of their time rehearsing and learning the songs so that the children could have such a wonderful experience. 



Exploring Evolution

On Tuesday a group of scientists from Year 3 and 4 went on a journey through time to find out all about Darwin's theory of evolution. We travelled to Epsom Primary School to meet scientist Andrew Smith and a whole range of amazing creatures who helped us to learn about adaptation and natural selection. We learnt about how terrapins, turtles and tortoises all have a common ancestor, how to work out the amount of legs a millipede has and many other amazing clues which tell us how animals have evolved. We had a fantastic day and loved the opportunity to be scientists for the day.



County High 5 Netball Tournament

An ambassador for Surrey School Games warmly congratulated us and talked about the importance of the Values: determination, honesty, passion, respect, self-belief and teamwork. This was a highly regarded award and to win it seemed just as prized - if not more – than winning the tournament itself!





The 1918 flu pandemic was a lethal outbreak of influenza which infected 500 million people around the world, including remote Pacific islands and the Arctic, and resulted in the deaths of 50 to 100 million (three to five percent of the world's population) making it one of the deadliest natural disasters in human history. It killed the young and not the old, and was spread around the world by troops returning home after the First World War. It was known as Spanish flu because the other warring countries of Europe would not admit to having it – Spain did because it was neutral, and its King almost died. Discover the effects of this outbreak and the efforts to counteract it.

Discover Dad's Army Wednesday 30 May 2pm to 3.30pm



On Friday 10 May 1940, the Germans had started their attack on Belgium and the Netherlands, using soldiers dropped by parachutes. British troops in mainland Europe were pushed back to the Channel ports and many people feared that the Germans would soon invade. To protect Britain, a new part-time force was to be set up, the Local Defence Volunteers. The Government made an urgent appeal on the radio to all men aged between 17 and 65 to become part-time soldiers. Within 24 hours of the radio broadcast a quarter of a million men had volunteered. Many men who joined the Home Guard when they could not join the regular army because their day-time jobs were necessary to keep the country running.
