Dear Parents,






### Attendance this week

# Changes to Free School Meal Eligibility under Universal Credit

The eligibility criteria for free school meals has changed. This letter explains these changes and how they might affect you.

#### What are the new eligibility criteria?

Children are entitled to receive free school meals if they or their parents or guardians receive any of the benefits below:

Universal Credit, provided they have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

**Income Support** 

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guarantee element of Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC

Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

#### I do not currently claim free school meals – what does this mean for me?

If you think you might be eligible for free school meals please see Mrs Pereira in the school office for a claim form. The information you provide will be used to check if you are in receipt of a qualifying benefit described above and, if you are on Universal Credit, that your earnings do not exceed the threshold. If you claim Universal Credit, your earnings will be assessed from up to three of your last Universal Credit assessment periods.

If you are eligible, the school will be notified. Your child will receive free school meals and the school will receive extra funding.

#### I am currently claiming free school meals – what does this mean for me?

Most people will not be affected by the new criteria. If you are currently claiming free school meals, but do not meet the new criteria, your child will continue to receive free school meals until the end of the Universal Credit rollout period. This will apply even if your earnings rise above the new threshold or if you stop being entitled to Universal Credit. The rollout period is currently scheduled to end in March 2022.

Once Universal Credit is fully rolled out, your child will keep their free school meal until the end of their current phase of education, i.e. until your child leaves primary school.

### What should your child have with them at school?

While we have the lovely weather, everyone needs a suitable hat and water bottle (with fresh water every morning), and have a layer of suitable sun cream on. The children can bring sun cream in with them, but the container must be labelled with their name and kept in their bag, and they must be able to apply it themselves. Maybe consider a cream which will last the whole day, instead.

Lip salve—again this must be labelled and kept in their bag, so it isn't shared with other children. Anything without a name on will be brought down to the office and if it isn't claimed quickly, then it will be put in the rubbish bin.

Full PE kit, named—why not leave it here for the half term so you don't have to remember it each week?

### Has your child borrowed a tie from the school office?

Ties cost £4 and the school has bought a lot of them over the years, which have been borrowed and not returned. All the Juniors should wear a tie, unless a teacher says they don't have to, for example because it is very hot, but we don't have any more to lend out.

Please have a look around at home for ties with SPPS on the back, and ask your child to return it on Monday.

Children in Y6 have a new option at lunchtime — the very popular paninis—in addition to the main meal now available. This will only be offered to children who have already said that they are having a meal on a Tuesday and / or Thursday. On those mornings, at registration, the children having a school dinner will be asked if they would like to have a panini for lunch and which filling they would like. They will be able to choose from one or more of cheese, tuna or ham, or if there is a suitable item from the main meal, such as meatballs, they will be able to choose that. 
