



Changes to School Meal Patterns after the half term break One Week to Change Patterns

Whatsapp—Age Limit Changing

There have been some issues based around use of Whatsapp among some of the older children at school, and in view of this, we want to alert parents to news that while the user age limit for Whatsapp is currently 13 years of age, it is expected to be changing to 16 years across the EU countries in the next few weeks.





The idea behind this is to protect young people, as anyone with the phone number of the device can contact through WhatsApp. It's important for anyone in a responsibility role to keep a level of accountability when a minor is using chat services such as this. Make sure the young person knows that in group chats everyone in the group can see your messages. Make sure they know not to give their details to strangers.

Make sure their chats aren't completely unsupervised and they know the rules around picture sharing. It's also a good idea to change their setting so only 'my friends' or 'only me' can see their profile photograph.
