#### **Dear Parents**

We have had a very exciting week as the school with the filled with scientists - we have certainly inspired some scientists of the future! Science week commenced with the Forensic Science Workshops and the children thoroughly enjoyed investigating 'CSI style' using scientific skills to find clues. Many thanks to the Friends for fully funding this amazing experience for all the children - we have had so many comments from parents about how much their children enjoyed the workshops.

There has been a buzz around the school during science week, with each class carrying out a different investigation each day, creating a real sense of awe and wonder and curiosity! Thank you too, to the science technicians at Rosebery who have come to work with Year 6 this week, bringing with them not only their expertise but a range of scientific equipment and resources the children do not have access to at primary school. We have had so many entries for the science experiment competition that the judging has been extremely difficult. A winner has been selected from each class, with an overall winner from each phase too. The science teachers from Rosebery spent a long time selecting the winners and they were very impressed with the standard of the entries.



The week has finished on a real high with a Science Fair for all the children today, with each class preparing experiments for other classes to try. There have been gasps and squeals of delight from the hall all day as the children found out something new! They have organised such a brilliant week, and we are all extremely grateful to both of them for creating such a successful event.



Our youngest children in Reception had their first school trip out this week to Ladyland Farm, and had an amazing time, it really enhanced their learning on their topic of living and growing. Only one school is allowed to attend each day so it provides many opportunities for the children to have a "hands on" opportunity to hold the animals and to get up close, which the children absolutely loved.

Year 6 have also been out, this time at Chessington World of Adventures on Tuesday. I know they all had a fantastic time, having looked forward to the trip since September (it is one of the highlights of the year!). Thank you to the staff for organising such enjoyable trips, your help and support, as always, is much appreciated!



Over the past term a group of Year 4 children have been busily rehearsing their dance to perform at the annual Epsom and Ewell Schools Dance Festival at Epsom Playhouse. On Tuesday and Wednesday evenings Miss Smith, Mrs Glasspool and Mrs Walker accompanied them as the children took to the stage in a fantastic performance with all the other local schools. They clearly loved the opportunity to perform on a real stage and it was a delight to be in the audience. 


You will be well aware that the issue of parking outside the school has been a considerable concern for a number of years, presenting a safety issue for the whole community. Following discussions with our local MP, Chris Grayling, and Damian Roberts, Chief operations Officer from Epsom and Ewell Borough Council, I am delighted to say that it has now been proposed by the Council, subject to public

consultation, that the car park becomes a Controlled Parking Zone. This means that anyone parking illegally could be issued with a parking ticket by parking enforcement officers. The consultation process will be commencing within the next week or two, with adverts being placed in the Epsom Guardian and notices being posted locally. It is hoped that the Controlled Parking Zone will be in place for the beginning of the new academic year, in September 2018. I am sure that you will all agree that this is a major step forward and will help ensure that people using the car park will park more safely and considerately.

A number of concerned parents have spoken to us recently regarding unsafe behaviour of some of the Junior children around the bike sheds before school in the morning. Some children have been seen climbing, or attempting to climb, on the roof, risking serious injury. This is taking place before the start of the school day, when the children remain the responsibility of their parents, and is out of view of the staff. We will carry out 'spot checks' to check children are behaving sensibly, but would ask all parents to speak to their children about safety and to ensure their child is adequately supervised.

It is at this time of year when we inevitably have to say farewell to some of our colleagues at Southfield Park as they move on to new experiences and adventures. Nicola Brown, our Phase 1 Leader and teacher in Britten Class will be moving on to a primary school in Sutton to be an Assistant Head. This promotion is a great opportunity for Miss Brown, who has contributed so much to Southfield Park in the four years she has been with us,



Our sporting events have continued this week with a group of Year 5 and 6 children representing the school at a tri golf tournament on Thursday at Epsom Downs Golf Club. The children played well and came third overall, which was a fantastic achievement. This morning a group of children from Year 2 competed in their own tri golf competition at Horton Golf Club, again the children played well, also coming third overall. Both Miss Smith and Mrs Crawford, who accompanied the Y2 children, were immensely proud of how well the children played, how they supported each other and the excellent ambassadors they were for Southfield Park. Thank you also to all the parents for transporting and supporting the children.



### Science Sparks Our Imagination

This week there has been a real buzz around the school with Science week. The children have had some excellent opportunities to carry out various investigations in their classes. On Monday and Tuesday every child in the school got the opportunity to become forensic scientists. A crime had been committed and the children had to use all their scientific knowledge to help solve the mystery! Children had to examine footprints, look for DNA and gather other pieces of evidence from their crime scene. The children had an amazing immersive experience and we are very grateful to the PTA for giving the children this great opportunity.

Today Year 6 and all of our lovely teaching assistants have been showcasing the week's learning with a Science fair. The children have had the chance to take part in a range of Science investigations including launching rockets as high as they could and using air pressure to race balloons. We are also very grateful to Blenheim School for lending us some of their Science equipment including a working planetarium and 'Sam' the friendly skeleton which the children were fascinated by. We are overwhelmed with the incredible Science projects that we have received from home and are really looking forward to announcing our class and phase winners next week. ### Rosebery Science Day

The Rosebery Science Day was a fantastic experience as it involved a range of chemical experiments, giving us an exciting preview of never-before-seen High School Chemistry. These six activities included identifying acids and alkalines and transforming one into another. We then used polymers to create multicoloured (red and/or green) beads and strings. We also used blue PVA glue to make a squishy bouncy ball.

After that, we moved rooms and began on the next set of experiments. We began by growing crystals using liquid salt and ink. We then tested car battery acid, oven cleaner, toothpaste, lemon juice and vinegar to see where they were on the pH scale. Lastly, we used different chemicals to create a dark blue, yellow, black and pink rainbow in a test tube.

All in all, it was a memorable occasion and on behalf of Year 6 we would like to say a massive thank you to Rosebery High School for bringing their equipment and expertise to our school.


