Dear Parents,






#### Attendance this week

#### **Sports Day Final Arrangements**

Dear Parents.

We are all very much looking forward to our Sports Day on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> July and are keeping our fingers crossed for a dry day. I am just writing to confirm the arrangements to ensure the day runs as smoothly as possible.

We will begin the Infants Sports at approximately 10.45am and as you know, we are walking the children from school to meet you there. The gates to the Harrier centre will be open from 10.15am for spectators. The Junior House Captains will accompany the Infant classes so they can support their houses in the Infant events. When we arrive at the Harrier centre the children will use the footpath around the edge of the car park for safety, and we will then walk them across the grass and through the gate to the grass area at the centre of the track. The games will take place on the grass and parents can watch from the track, and obviously cheer everyone on!

The Junior children will arrive for lunch at approximately 12 midday, and you will be able to collect your children (Infants and Juniors) at that time from their teachers and enjoy a picnic with them on the grass. If you are not able to join them for lunch please make sure they have a packed lunch which they can carry with them. You may like to bring a picnic rug to sit on, and some shade if it's a hot day! Infant children will be signed out from their teachers for the afternoon, and are then free to go home after lunch if parents wish although they are more than welcome to stay and watch the Juniors with their parents during the afternoon.

Junior children will be signed out for the picnic lunch, and afterwards (approx 12.30pm) we will ring a bell for the Juniors only to return to their class base to be registered for the afternoon session. If you are unable to come and watch, or cannot take your Infant child home after their events due to work commitments, please make sure you have let the school office know about this. In this case they will be welcome to stay with their class teacher to watch the Junior sports events, but must be collected from the Harrier Centre at the end of the day at **3.00pm**.

The Junior Sports will begin at 12.45pm. We will have some fun games on the central grass area, which parents can watch from the track, and then complete the afternoon with some more formal running races on the track. For these track events we ask you to stand in the area next to the club house on the opposite side of the track from the children. The children will sit on the grass area next to the track in their Houses to cheer each other on and will be supervised by adults from school. For security reasons the children will not be allowed to cross the track to stand with their parents or receive drinks or snacks at this stage, but must stay with the rest of the children so please make sure they have a bottle of water or a drink available whilst they are competing. It makes it very difficult for supervising adults to check that all the children are present if the children are not all in one place and wander off to see their family and we are sure you all understand this.

At the end of the afternoon, parents of children in the Junior classes will be able to collect them from their class base in the centre of the arena and will be asked to sign them out. We anticipate that the day will end at 3pm and all children will need to be collected from The Harrier Centre at that time.

To avoid the children having to carry too many belongings to the Harrier centre we will send home PE kits on Wednesday after school and ask the children to come to school in their **correct** PE kit on Thursday morning, please ensure the children are wearing shorts not tracksuits. If they have a T shirt in their House colour they should wear that in place of their normal PE top so we can easily identify who is in each team and add to team spirit. Please make sure you return their PE kit to school on Friday as it will be needed for PE lessons.

We have been asked by the Harrier Centre to request that ladies avoid wearing stiletto heeled shoes as they can damage the track. I hope I have covered everything but if you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact me or your child's teacher. We look forward to seeing you on Thursday.

# Epsom celebrates the 400-year-anniversary of the discovery of Epsom Salts

We've all heard of Epsom Derby but did you know that the multi-billion pound global market in Epsom Salts originated from a single well in Epsom in 1618?

The local waters filled with magnesium sulphate attracted the likes of Samuel Pepys and Nell Gwynne to spend the summer season at Epsom Spa (England's very first spa town) to drink and bathe in the health-giving mineral waters - and enjoy some riotous entertainment on the side...

Next week [2-8 July] the borough is celebrating this 400 -year anniversary with a unique creative arts festival. There will be 40 events, exhibitions and activities over 7 days.
