Dear Parents,

Thank you so very much to everyone who supported our MacMillan Coffee Afternoon today, whether you sent cakes in, or you came in and enjoyed a cup of team with a slice of cake or even purchased a cake at the cake sale – your support was greatly appreciated. We will let you know next week how much was raised for this fantastic charity, one which I know is very close to people's hearts.



On Monday we were informed that the 2019 review of the Epsom & Ewell Polling Districts and Polling Places has now started. This review identifies current polling places for each of the 13 wards and any proposed changes for the next five years.

You are all aware that Southfield Park is one of two polling stations in Court Ward and so closes during elections. This has been challenged many times but due to unsuitable alternatives the school has had no option but to close. Going forward, Horton Chapel has been suggested as an alternative and although the review recognises this possibility, there is no proposed change to the polling venue at the current time.

I have formally responded on behalf of the school requesting that Horton Chapel replaces Southfield Park as a polling venue as soon as possible, and I ask that parents support us and do the same. The more people that respond could hopefully make a difference.

The consultation documents for the review are available on the Epsom & Ewell website <https://www.epsom-ewell.gov.uk/council/elections-and-voting/electoral-boundaries>, while representations should be made via email to [electoralservices@epsom-ewell.gov.uk](mailto:electoralservices@epsom-ewell.gov.uk) or in writing to Epsom & Ewell, Borough Council, Electoral Services (Polling Review), Town Hall, The Parade, Epsom, Surrey KT18 5BY. The deadline to make representations on this review is **5pm, 16th October 2019**.

There was a buzz of excitement on Wednesday morning when the children set off and although the weather has been very changeable, the children have had the most amazing time, which can be seen from the brilliant pictures on our Twitter feed @Southfield\_Park. 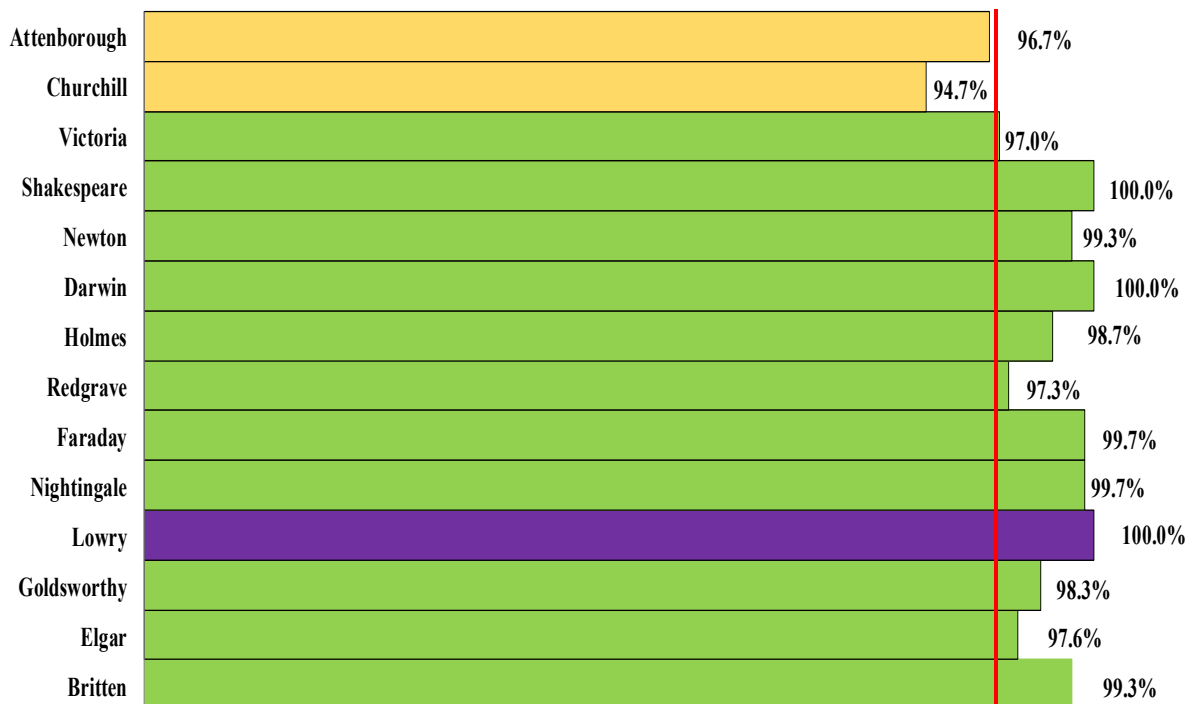


## Attendance this week

# Children in Need 'Ramble'

## Friday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2019

Following the success of our event in 2017, this year we are again organising a **Children in Need 'Ramble'** in Horton Country Park to coincide with the 'Ramble Weekend' inspired by BBC's 'Country File'. This will be our first 'House' event of the year and will help raise money for this very worthwhile cause that we support each year.



It be a whole school event, with each House walking to the park as a group at different times throughout the morning. When we arrive, we will do short, circuit route looking at different features of the environment and enjoying being outdoors in natural surroundings. What is lovely about going in our House teams is that there is a mixed age group of children all exploring together and looking after each other. We feel this will be a very enriching experience for all children and most of all, we will have some fun whilst raising some money for an important cause!

As the event is being organised to raise the money for Children in Need, we feel the simplest and most effective way would be for children to make a donation to take part in the ramble.

**On the day, the children can come to school wearing their own clothes but they must be suitable for a walk in the park. As we are walking, children also need to wear comfortable shoes, trainers or boots- please choose a pair that you don't mind getting a little muddy!**

In order for the ramble to take place, we need as many parent/carer helpers as we can to walk with us to make it a safe and enjoyable experience. As we will be walking in large groups, volunteers for this event will not need a DBS check to take part in the walk. If you would like to take part and volunteer, please fill in the slip below, stating which walk you would like to volunteer on.

As parents sign a permission slip for 'Local Visits on Foot' when children first start at school, there is no need to sign a separate permission slip for the ramble. However, if you would not like your child to participate in the ramble, please advise your child's class teacher so that arrangements for the day can be made for them.

We are writing to inform you that the Immunisation Team will be moving to e-consenting for our school based immunisation programme from the start of the 2019/2020 academic year.

Using e-consent is quicker and easier for you and can be completed on any platform i.e. mobile phone, tablet or computer. However in the event that this is not possible, please contact the immunisation team.

Your child is due to receive the Flu vaccination on **Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2019**. You can find out further information about this vaccine in this leaflet and at the following links:

**Please ensure that you complete and submit your child's consent form promptly, whether you wish your child to be immunised or not.** Parents who have not submitted their consent form by the deadline and wish their child to be immunised will need to call the immunisation team to book an appointment at a community catch up clinic.

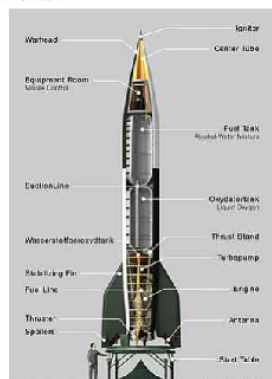

**Hitler's Vengeance**  
**Weapons**  
**October 12**

13 June 1944 was the day the first flying bombs hit London. A week before, on D-Day, Allied armies had invaded German-occupied France. Soon after, Soviet armies launched a massive offensive in Poland. From the skies over Germany, British and American bombers were able to raid German cities at will. Facing disaster on every side, Germany deployed revenge weapons in a bid to terrorise British civilians and undermine morale. Known as the 'doodlebugs' or 'buzz bombs' on account of the distinctive sound they made when in flight, these winged bombs were powered by a jet engine and launched from a ramp, or later from adapted bomber aircraft. 29 V1 Flying Bombs fell in the Borough from June to October 1944. They killed 13 people and injured 251, destroying 86 properties, seriously damaging 200 and inflicting blast damage on 9,000 more. The first V2 hit London on 8 September 1944, a streamlined rocket which stood as tall as a four-storey building. Powered by a rocket engine, the V2 blasted its way to the edge of space before falling back to Earth at supersonic speed.
