Dear Parents,

We began the week with an assembly by a group of our Year 6 children who have formed a fundraising team to raise money for the World Wildlife Fund. They spoke eloquently to all the children about their concerns for wildlife across the world, and it made us all so proud to see their passion and commitment. They gave up their lunch breaks on Monday and Tuesday to bake treats at school and even went home to continue their baking efforts, and on Wednesday morning break the stalls in the Infant and Junior playgrounds were jam-packed with customers. The group are running a stall at the Christmas Fair so we will let you know the final fundraising figure when they combine the proceeds from both events. A huge thank you on behalf of the group to everyone who sent in additional cakes to sell, it made it a real community event.



Is your child sick or going to be away from school today?

We need to hear from you (ie a parent, not a sibling or other relative) <u>every day</u> if your child isn't going to be in school.

If you know in advance that your child will be absent, for whatever reason, please email, phone or visit the office, and wherever possible show us proof of the appointment.

If your child is sick, please leave a message on the Absence Line (tel: 01372 847965), giving your child's name, class and reason for absence. For short absences, such as medical appointments let us know if they will be back for lunch so we know whether to keep them in the numbers or not. For safeguarding reasons, we will contact you if you haven't left a message by 9am that morning, or told us in advance, as we have a duty of care to ensure that every child is safe.

Terracycle recycling update



In March this year, we launched 3 recycling schemes: Crisp Packets, Biscuit Wrappers and Writing Instruments. In the lunch hall, we have two separate boxes for the children to put their empty crisp packets and biscuit wrappers in. When the weather was nice enough for children to eat their packed lunches outside (that seems a long time ago!) we also had collections bins outside. Each classroom has a box in which used pens can be placed. All these items would otherwise end up in the rubbish bins, and ultimately go to landfill sites, so we are really happy that we can recycle them.

We need to collect quite a large quantity before we send them to be recycled, so Mrs Page takes them home and stores them at her house until we have enough to send away or take to recycling points. All of our writing instruments are taken to The Greville School in Ashtead and they send them off to Terracycle so that they can be recycled. Mrs Page sends off the other items directly to Terracycle and in return we are given points that can be turned into money for the school. So far we have raised just over £84 for the school! We know that this is not going to make a huge difference to the school budget, but when you consider that it is 'money for nothing' then it is definitely very welcome. We will be discussing how to use the money to improve our wellbeing: one suggestion is to buy some plants for the classrooms, as research shows that they can enhance children's learning.

Remember we welcome your items from home for these recycling schemes. There are three separate boxes in the entrance to the school. Before placing your items in the boxes, please check the signs on the boxes for what we can accept to be recycled. There has been a change to what items can be placed in the 'crisp packet' box. As well as any brand of crisp packet (including multipack wrappers), we can now also accept popcorn, pretzel and nut packets. However, due to allergies we ask that you do not bring nut packets into school, so if you have any you would like to donate please email Mrs Page directly at jo.page@southfield-park.surrey.sch.uk so she can arrange to collect them from you in the car park, off of school premises. We are also collecting Pringle tubes – please do not squash them, and you can give us all the bits including the foil seal and the plastic lid. Unfortunately no other similar tubes are accepted – only the Pringles brand.

Please contact the school office if you are interested in offering it a home. Free of charge or a small donation to the school fund welcome!


