### Dear Parents/Carers,

It was lovely to see so many parents at our consultation meetings on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. 




# Attendance this week

## Parent, staff and pupil Wellbeing Surveys

I wanted to take the opportunity to say thank you to all the parents, carers, pupils and staff who have completed our recent Wellbeing Surveys and who shared ideas with us via the Wellbeing Stall at Parents' evening. Your feedback is so valuable to us and we will be using your comments and suggestions to help us create our Wellbeing Action Plan. Overall feedback has been incredibly positive and I thought it would be good to share some of the headlines and comments:

Most parents and staff, who completed the survey, agree or strongly agree that the school really cares about the emotional wellbeing and mental health of everyone involved in the school

Children in Years 3-6, strongly agree that they learn how important it is to talk about their feelings and emotions at school. They also strongly agree that the school really cares about how they are feeling.

The pupil feedback comments were very positive too:

'This school is great', 'Our school does a lot of learning about feelings and emotions', 'Our school is very kind and people care for each other', 'Can't get any better', 'They include my ideas and respect my opinions.'

# Anxiety workshop for parents and carers Southfield Park Primary School Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December 2019 at 9.00 am Delivered by Ruth Leaver-Lewis from CAMHS

Ruth is a CAMHS (Child and Adolescent Mental Health service) Primary Mental Health Worker and Art Therapist at North East Surrey CAMHS. She works with children, families and schools in this area to provide early intervention mental health advice and support to prevent mental health difficulties.

The talk on anxiety for parents and carers aims to:

- Define anxiety
- Recognise triggers that can cause anxiety both in yourself as a parent and in your child
- Recognise signs and symptoms of anxiety
- Explain cycle of anxiety using a cognitive behavioural model
- Explain how anxiety can be managed by exploring some helpful suggestions and solutions
- Know where to go and get help if needed

We are unable to accommodate pre-school children of any age at this event, so please don't bring them!

A World War 2 Christmas - Saturday December 14

1pm to 2.30pm





For many families, the most difficult part of a wartime Christmas was spending the festive season apart from loved ones. Many men were fighting abroad in the armed forces or were being held as prisoners of war. Women might also be away in the services or carrying out war work. Many children spent Christmas away from home as evacuees. By the end of the war, thousands of families had suffered the death of a family member either in action or from enemy bombing raids. Christmas luxuries were especially hard to come by at a time when even basic foods were scarce and people were forced to find substitutes for key festive ingredients. Gifts were often homemade and practical, and children's toys would be made from recycled materials. Cards were smaller and printed on flimsy paper but people still did their best to have a good
