Dear Parents,

The children have loved Book Week and dressing up as book characters was a real highlight of the week for them—you could feel the excitement as they walked through the gate. Thanks to everyone, children parents and staff, for making the effort to make it a memorable day for the children. There were prizes for the best costume in each class but the judging was very tricky indeed!

Over the week we managed to cram so much in with the children; 'buddying up' with children in other classes for shared reading, teachers swapping classes for story time, the book swap organized by the Friends and decorating the classroom doors to showcase their themed book from Book Browse this week. We have judged the door competition today, and again it was not an easy task but the most imaginative door was created by Wilmot class, so congratulations to them. You will all be aware of the troubling situation in Ukraine. On Monday, our assembly for the older junior children looked at some of the events with a focus on feelings and emotions and contrasting peaceful and aggressive solutions to problems we might face. The children in younger year groups will be discussing it in very simple, age appropriate ways with their teachers in the classroom next week. There have been many expressions of support for Ukraine, locally and nationally, and we know we have a number of families from both Russia and Ukraine who have families affected. We have therefore decided to hold a day of peace next Friday, 11th March and ask all the children to wear blue and yellow in return for a voluntary donation, with the funds raised going to charities to support those affected in Ukraine. During the day we will look at peaceful solutions to conflict and celebrate peace in an age appropriate way.

As we gradually return to 'business as usual', Year 4 will be undertaking their Bikeability course next week. The children are very much looking forward to it and it is so crucial that they learn the skills they need to travel safely outside of school. Watch out next week for updates on Twitter!

Parent workshops are one of ways we can share with parents how we deliver the curriculum to the children. Maths is always an area where we have lots of questions and in response to requests, Mrs Williams, our Maths curriculum leader, will be delivering two workshops for parents. You will have received an email about this yesterday. The first, aimed at parents of children in Reception to Year 2, is being held on Wednesday 16th March at 2pm, with a further session for Years 3-6 on Thursday 17th March, again at 2:00pm. 




Book Week Fun!




