It is a privilege to be part of such a caring and empathetic school community and I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone for your support for our day of peace last Friday, and your generosity. We raised over £1300, which will go to the

British Red Cross crisis fund and will then be match funded by the Government through the DEC (Disasters Emergency Committee). Today we have supported Comic Relief and the children had great fun at the House event this afternoon. The range of red noses on display this year has been amazing, as is the sum raised—£470! All the money raised will go to



help support some incredible charities, and will make a massive difference to many people.

Over the past few weeks, we have recommenced our sporting fixtures and the children are enjoying the opportunity to be out and about, competing against others schools. On 8th March, Mrs Pereira accompanied our girls' football team, from Years 5 and 6, to participate in a tournament organised by Chelsea Football Club. There were some excellent individual performances but what shone through was the teamwork they all showed. They won, drew and lost some matches but whatever the outcome they gave 100% commitment. On the same day, a group of Year 5 and 6 children attended a Tag Rugby event hosted by Harlequins Rugby Club. This was a mixture of drills, skills and matches and again was thoroughly enjoyed by all the children who took part. We were so proud of how

Last week, our Year 6 children took part in football matches against Wallace Fields Junior School and Cuddington Croft Primary School, hosted at Wallace Fields. We fielded both an A and B team, comprising boys and girls, who played superbly, showing real team spirit and commitment. Although they didn't win the matches, they were very competitive as all the teams were closely matched, a single goal being the winning margin in them all. We were so proud of all of the children for their team spirit and sportsmanlike behaviour throughout.

The netball team had their first outing of the season too last week with some friendly matches against Stamford Green to prepare them for the netball rally, which will be attended by all the other local school next week. The friendly matches were a great opportunity for the team to hone their skills and become match ready. Watch this space for an update on how they get on next week.

This Thursday we also saw the children in Years 3 and 4 take their first steps in competitive events against other schools, at the Tag Rugby Tournament. It was a great experience for them and they rose to the challenge so well showing team spirit and grit.

Last week we also saw our Year 4 children complete their Bikeability training. It is so important that they learn to be safe and considerate road users and this is the first part of their journey towards this. As usual, the trainers were so complimentary about the children's behaviour and attention.

It was lovely to greet so many of our Reception parents to the Parent Consultation meetings for this year group on Monday and Tuesday this week. I am sure you all welcomed the opportunity to find out about your child's progress and targets for the rest of the year. Time certainly flies by quickly. For the remainder of the school, Years 1 to 6, the annual report for your child will be sent home in the final week of this term and there will be the usual Parent Consultations in July. Our report format is slightly changed this year but we will issue more information about this before they are sent out.



On Thursday the Reception children walked to Christ Church in Epsom to learn about 'special places' as part of them developing their knowledge and understanding of the world. The church organised a hunt around the building to find some important features of a church which they really enjoyed. As always we had a warm welcome from the team there, and the children learned so much.

Those of you that attended the maths workshops run by Mrs Williams this week will, I am sure, have learned a great deal about how we teach maths at school and develop the children's mathematical understanding. We always have feedback that it is so different from how parents learned maths at Primary school and they are often surprised at the level of complexity in maths that is covered by the time the children are in upper Key Stage 2. Thank you to all those who attended and to Mrs Williams who planned and ran the workshops.

I hope you have all received the email regarding the recruitment for my successor from September. I am really looking forward to working with Miss Lauren Clogg throughout the summer term to ensure the handover is as smooth as possible. I know that I am leaving the school in great hands and I am excited for her and the school.

It has been lovely for the children to enjoy some spring sunshine at playtimes this week, although we have had to dodge some showers too! It really does make a difference to everyone's wellbeing so we are hoping for more next week.







'Emotional Me!'

Pencil Cases and PE Kit


Please can parents of children in Junior classes check the contents of pencil cases and replenish as necessary, and everyone check PE kit. A lot of children are not coming in with the correct things.







What can archaeology tell us about Roman Ewell? Easter event Wednesday 13 April 2pm to 3.30pm



Discover how people learnt to live with Roman power as a small native village became a busy roadside town. Learn how the building of a road brought a new world of ideas, food, pottery, trade and strangers to the area and gave locals a chance to see the world. Learn something of their beliefs. Hear tales of the Roman underworld, sacred springs and sacrifices sealing deep sacred shafts full of gifts to the gods. Learn about what was uncovered during a recent dig, even more strange than earlier discoveries! Archaeology adds to our knowledge, how pollen and snail shells can paint a picture of their surroundings, how their food waste gives us clues as what they eat, how they butchered their meat, discover a dark side to Roman Ewell – slavery! Where did they hide their money in times of trouble? See and handle Roman artefacts.
