Dear Parents,

As you may be aware the government has issued new guidance for schools following the decision to cease all universal testing for Covid 19 from 1 April 2022, key headlines include:

- asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended.
- families may decide to seek a PCR test if symptomatic, and if this is positive a child (anyone under 18) should avoid contact with others and not come to school for 3 days this is extended to 5 days for adults.
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can come back to school, when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Schools will no longer receive any test kits.



Finally, the highlight of the week was the musical visit from the mini orchestra, 'Kidenza' on Thursday. Each phase enjoyed an interactive and mesmerising performance from the prestigious musicians including pieces

such as 'Rhapsody in Blue' by Gershwin and 'Winter' from the 'Four Seasons' by Vivaldi. They cleverly interwove all of the learning that the children have completed so far this year in







# NO NUTS OR SESAME

As it's the start of term we'd like to remind you that we have children in school with life-threatening allergies to nuts or sesame seeds, so if your child has a packed lunch at any time, please ensure that these ingredients are not included in any of the food, even as a trace ingredient.

Parents sometimes query items such as chocolate spread, so please be aware that a quick scan of the supermarket shelves show that brands other than Nutella may also contain nuts, so its important to check the ingredients.

Items from the chocolate aisle should not be included in lunches, and will be put aside for the child to bring home at the end of the day.

We encourage parents to apply long-lasting sunscreen when the weather requires it, and it has been brought to our attention that some sunscreens may also contain nut oil, including this particular product:

# Attendance Policy 2021-2022

Dear Parent/Carer

We are aware that the pandemic has had an effect on families, but the expectation is still that every child should now be attending school full time. If you consider that there are exceptional circumstances relating to your request, please let the school have full details. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis.

#### Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school (absence without the agreement of the school or not covered by a medical note) and will be used by Surrey Council in the following circumstances :-

1. Pupils identified by police and Inclusion Officers (formerly Education Welfare Officers) engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.

2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more).

- Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.
- In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body must decide whether there are exceptional circumstances. They may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised.

Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. Finally, the issuing of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance.

This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you act without delay to secure their regular attendance.

If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement in your child's attendance, please contact your child's school or the Inclusion Officer.

#### Penalty Notice relating to Exclusions

If a child is excluded from school, Section 103 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 places a duty on parents/carers to ensure that their child is not in a public place without justifiable cause during school hours.

This duty applies to the *first five days of each exclusion*. Failure to do so will render the parent/carer liable to a Penalty Notice. (Alternative education provision will be made available from the sixth day of any exclusion.)

#### **Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice**

The amount payable for a Penalty Notice issued in any of the above circumstances is currently  $\pounds 60$  if paid within **21** days of receipt of the Notice, rising to  $\pounds 120$  if paid after **21** days but within **28** days.

If the Penalty Notice is not paid, the local Authority must consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court for the offence for which the Notice was originally issued.

Please be aware that <u>each</u> parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for <u>each</u> child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents, and two children incur unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 21 days.
