







This week, we have been learning all about how to keep ourselves safe around Roads. As part of our week, the School Councillors were tasked with assisting their teacher in delivering Road Safety sessions to the class. The school councillors were very excited about their role and the important messages regarding how to keep safe were thoroughly explained to all the children. In Key Stage 1, the story of 'Super Cat' and his rap (see below) helped the children to remember key points when they are near roads. Whereas, in Key stage 2, following the session the children took part in a quiz which challenged their knowledge and thinking regarding different scenarios.

In addition, our 'Question of the Week' was linked to Road safety and it was a delight to hear the conversations this promoted emongst the children

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Bus Service Consultation

Surrey County Council has launched a nine-week consultation on the future for bus services in Surrey. The consultation is seeking residents' views on three areas:

Investing in cleaner, greener buses - to help reduce the 41% of carbon emissions generated by transport

Introducing more on-demand services - shared, door-to-door bus services in rural areas that are available when needed, using a booking service

Changing some bus services - reducing a very small amount of bus services. This is because people are using buses less and they are also more expensive to run. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, 27 million passenger trips were made each year on Surrey buses. Trips have since reduced to 18 million.





Consultation on admission arrangements for Surrey's community and voluntary controlled schools for 2024



Surrey County Council is consulting on proposed changes to admission arrangements for some community and voluntary controlled schools for September 2024.

Full details of the consultation and the changes being proposed are available at <u>www.surreysays.co.uk</u>.

Why Surrey County Council is consulting

Surrey County Council has a statutory duty to consult on admission arrangements if it intends to make a change. The changes being proposed are as follows:

- Southfield Park Primary School extension of the catchment area to include the Parkview estate, as a replacement for priority on the basis of 'nearest school' and amendment of the tie breaker within catchment so that children living closer to the school receive higher priority
- Stamford Green Primary School introduction of a catchment area to replace priority on the basis of 'nearest school'
- 3. Beauclerc Infant School reduction in published admission number for Reception from 40 to 30
- 4. Farncombe Infant School reduction of published admission number for Reception from 50 to 30

 St Ann's Heath Junior School – reduction of published admission number for Year 3 from 90 to 60 and removal of Meadowcroft Infant School as a feeder school (subject to it being agreed for Meadowcroft Infant School to become an all through primary school from September 2024)

How can you respond to the consultation?

The consultation on the admission arrangements for community and voluntary controlled schools and the proposed changes will run Wednesday 16 November 2022. If you would like to take part please complete an online response form at

Alternatively, if you would prefer to respond on a paper form, please telephone the Surrey Schools and Childcare Service on 0300 200 1004 to request a copy. Please note that only response forms which are fully completed with the respondent's name and address will be accepted.

What happens next?

After the closing date, responses will be collated and presented to the County Council's decision-making Cabinet on 31 January 2023. It will decide whether to proceed with the proposed changes as well as determining the admission arrangements for all community and voluntary controlled schools for which no changes are proposed. Cabinet's decision will then need to be ratified by the full County Council on 7 February 2023. Once determined the final admission arrangements for all community and voluntary controlled schools for 2024 will be placed on Surrey's website at www.surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.
