Dear Families,

I was lucky enough to visit the Year 4 dance club auditions on Monday last week. It was great to see such enthusiasm and a supportive group of children working together. We are in for a treat in June when the children will perform at the Dance Festival at Epsom Playhouse.

Miss Foley is running Glee club on a Friday after school and I know the children are incredibly excited to be performing at Epsom Playhouse before the Easter Break. I haven't yet seen what they are doing, so I am especially looking forward to seeing them when they are up on the stage.

Our Year 4 children were fantastic during their bikeability training last week. The children left their bikes outside my office each day and I overheard such positive encouragement for each other.

Mrs Smith and I have been popping into classrooms over these last few weeks. We have seen some really exciting things happening.

Reception absolutely wowed us with their magnificent writing about Mermaids and Pirates. The children were describing what these characters looked like from pictures and were doing such a great job.

Year 1 were having some interesting conversations about what was the same and different about the animals they were looking at – we agreed that crocodiles and sharks both have sharp teeth but only alligators spend time out of the water.

I had a lovely time with year 2 trying to identify what a super zoomed in picture was showing us. We guessed slug, hippo, the inside of an elephant's trunk, statue, turtle until we finally found out it was a dog. Year 3 were writing poetry about different habitats. They were focusing on the use of figurative language — speak to your children about the difference between similes and metaphors and what does onomatopoeia mean?

Year 4 have been doing lots of exciting things with tasting of different foods. I have overheard some really interesting description.

In year 5, I enjoyed listening into the discussions about which book

character they would like to invite to their dinner party. There were lots of interesting choices and the children really thought carefully about which would be a good match or not.

Year 6 have been flying through their maths learning and speaking with ever increasing confidence about the how and the why when discussing outcomes.

We had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day in school last week. A special mention goes to the parents who gave up their time to come in and support in some way – thank you. Also, a huge thank you for the book donations. We thoroughly enjoyed abandoning our learning and getting the chance to drop everything and read throughout the day. Thanks



to the families who were able to join us to look at our Fairy Tale doors after school on Friday too!

It was lovely to see so many of you at Reception Parent Consultations at the start of this week. It is great for us to be able to share with you how far your children have come since the start of the year. Thank you for all of your support helping your children to settle in. Attendance

Every term we have a visit from the Inclusion Team who work with families to improve attendance. Prosecution regarding attendance really is the last resort now. This week's visit was really positive and we were able to celebrate superb attendance for the vast majority of our children.

It is important that we continue to maximise attendance so that the impact of absence on children's learning and well-being is as small as possible. When children have a broken pattern of attendance, it can make it difficult to get back into a regular routine. Our aim at Southfield Park is to work with families that are struggling with attendance. If you need advice and support or are finding it difficult to get your child in to school, we are here to help. The Government counts children who have an absence rate that is below 90% as persistently absent. This is the equivalent of having half a day of absence a week. We have 64 children who are currently falling into this category which is just above the National and Surrey average. We'd like to see all of our children coming out of this category. Remember that we will always contact you if your child is in school and we are concerned about them.

Obviously, there are times when a child needs to be off school and it can be difficult to make those early morning decisions. I am Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Dublin-Cumberbatch. I have served Epsom & Ewell for three and half years and have worked in the Longmead area for the majority of the time. I enjoy serving my community and helping others. I am very passionate about engaging with young people and want to encourage them to be good citizens.

Current Trends

We have seen an increase in the number of children and young people wearing balaclavas and hoodies. Wearing balaclavas is closely linked to criminality and is not suitable for your children to wear. As a result, if seen in a balaclava your children may be subject to a Police Stop and Search.

This is intimidating for members of the public and has negative connotations associated with it. Open conversations with young people about the consequences of wearing balaclavas are a great way to discourage their use.

Anti-social Behaviour (ASB)

ASB is any aggressive, intimidating or destructive actions which causes alarm and destress to someone's quality of life. This includes wearing balaclavas and criminal offences such as damaging property, graffiti, taking drugs, rowdy and threatening behaviour.

We have had reports of school children causing disruption in groups around Epsom Town Centre after school times. This behaviour is not tolerated and will be dealt with robustly by the police.

School dinners: remember that the children can only change their meal patterns for the start of a new half term, so please email Mrs Catling on sarah.catling@southfield-park.surrey.sch.uk as soon as possible if a pattern is changing for after the Easter break

The 3 week rotating menu will be different for the summer term, so please have a look at the Spring/Summer Menu which was also attached to the email with the newsletter before deciding on whether your child will be having a school dinner or a packed lunch from home.

Remember that although it is a 3 week menu, the meal pattern must be the same for each week.

Children in Reception are given option 1, unless they have a special dietary requirement.

In Years 1-6 children with a special dietary requirement will be given a suitable meal from options 1 or 2. Everyone else is offered option 1 or 3, which is generally pasta or a jacket potato. Only a certain amount of option 3 is available, and Jackie puts out sufficient to make sure that both Infants and Juniors are able to chose it if they wish. It is available on a 'first come, first served' basis, but the year groups come into lunch on a rotating basis, and so will be able to make a choice of meal at some point.

Upcoming Easter Egg Trail in Rosebery Park, Epsom



Discover the worst jobs at sea, including the roles of the Scrubber, the Cook, the Powder Monkey and the Surgeon. Can you escape to become a Navigator? We look at the equipment they used, as well as the Boatswain and Carpenter. We have objects for each and willing volunteers can demonstrate each job. We go abroad the Nonsuch galleon. She was built by Queen Mary in 1555 as the *Philip and Mary*, renamed *Nonpareil* in 1584, and commanded by Sir Francis Drake in 1588. In June 1602 the English fleet with the Nonpareil defeated a Spanish galley fleet, taking a ship loaded with treasure valued at over a million ducats. In 1603 she was renamed Nonsuch, rebuilt as a great ship of 454 tons carrying 32 guns.

Epsom and Ewell history talk on WW2

Wednesday 3 April 11am to 12.30pm

The Borough suffered heavily in World War 2 and from 1940 to 1944, 890 alerts were sounded, 384 people were injured by enemy action and 33 killed. There were more than 200 incidents with 12,234 houses slightly damaged, 413 devastated and 192 destroyed, while thousands of incendiary and anti-personnel bombs were dropped with 440 high explosives, 64 oil and 30 flying bombs falling on the Borough.
